Rector's Message - by Fr. Jeff Murph

A few weeks ago, I had a conversation with one of our parishioners. When I realized that he was in fourth grade, I asked him, "Well, you are in fourth grade now; would you be interested in being trained as an acolyte?" He looked at me for a bit and then responded, "No, I think I want to wait until next year." That short moment of when he was thinking about it was kind of interesting. Obviously, he



knew what an acolyte did, I think he might even have wanted to do the job eventually but he evaluated his situation now and decided to wait a year until he thought the time would be right. When I was his age, I am not sure I would have had the same introspection.

The older I became, however, I began to recognize that some things just have to happen in their own time. For example, some people may date around for a few years but unless they meet someone who sweeps them off their feet, some are not really ready to settle down into a long-term relationship until something changes and all of a sudden they are. As a priest, I have known some people who have certainly been exposed to the good news of Jesus' love and forgiveness for a long time. Yet then, something happens (maybe they hear it in a new way) and their relationship with Jesus becomes real. Why is this the case? The bible sometimes uses the phrase, "the fullness of time", which really seems to mean, "when the time is right" but what is it that makes the time right for the important things in our lives?

Advent is sometimes described as the season of anticipation. It is a time of waiting for something that you really very much want to happen and you know that it WILL happen but it has not happened yet. For young children who are eager for the visit of Santa and the magic of Christmas Day, the anticipation is for Christmas finally to come. For others it might be the holiday visit of dearly missed family members from far away and the togetherness that will bring for everyone. Still for others, it might be the weary hope for God to heal the world and cure violence and cruelty and despair and want.

King David, in Psalm 13, writes, "How long, O Lord? Will you forget me for ever? How long will you hide your face from me? How long shall I have perplexity in my mind, and grief in my heart, day after day? How long shall my enemy triumph over me?" (Ps. 13:1-2). The Advent anticipation for the coming of Jesus is for God to make things right: in the world, in our communities and in our own personal lives. As we enter the season of anticipation, spare a prayer for God to bring our time into fullness.



New Carpet Match Donation

Many of you have seen the new carpet that was laid in the area between the Sanctuary and the Parish Hall. The older carpet had seen better days, and the wood floors underneath were not in the best shape, either. We have asked for donations to cover the cost of the improvement, and have received several donations to date. One generous donor has stepped forward, now, offering to match any donations made from this point on. The original cost of the carpeting was \$1,227.00. To date, we have received \$840, with an additional \$85 in matching monies, leaving a balance of \$302 needed to clear the debt. Because of the matching monies, St. Thomas is in need of only \$151 more in donations to cover the cost. between the Sunday services), but you could also opt to show up at 3:45 on Christmas Eve and still participate.




St. Thomas Kids Daycare Thanksgiving Celebration


