Rector's Message - by Fr. Jeff Murph

Over the time of my ministry, I have heard people tell me different stories about their journey of faith (I am always ready to listen to these accounts). Some can never remember NOT believing; it is just something that they have had since childhood and often faith, for them, is like breathing because it is so natural. Others, on the other hand, reject faith because they think that if they follow Jesus then they will have to change something in their life that they do not



really want to change. Still others struggle with faith because they imagine that faith is blind; they need at least some kind of evidence, they need something that can help them open themselves to trust. As members of a church named for St. Thomas, we ourselves can certainly appreciate their need and their struggle. And, as we see in John's gospel, God does meet people who are honestly seeking (and yet struggling) to give them what they need in order to take a final step from knowledge of facts to real faith and trust.


There is even a season in the Church Year that deals with this whole issue; it is the season of Epiphany, a Greek word that means "showing" or "manifestation". Often in the season of Epiphany, which starts with the wise men who were following a star, the readings focus on showing who Jesus is. Some examples include the story of water being changed into wine at a wedding or the story of Jesus' baptism, where a dove alighted on his head and the voice from heaven identified him, "This is my son, the beloved", or the Transfiguration, where Peter, James and John are given a vision of Jesus transformed along with Moses and Elijah. Each of these biblical accounts point to who Jesus is, they are evidence to those who see them that help lead to faith.

The pieces of evidence can still be perceived today by those who have open eyes to see. People can be healed (I certainly have seen that). Broken relationships can be restored by forgiveness (which can be a very hard thing to do). The lives of people can be changed in remarkable ways like liberation from addiction or the consolation from grief or just a repentance from a long-cherished sin. Often nonbelievers who come to faith point to how they saw the love of Jesus evident in the lives of Christian friends. And almost every Christian can point to an answered prayer as a sign of God working in their lives.

Faith in Christ Jesus is not blind; God meets those who truly seek him because, frankly, he has been the one who had been wooing them to him in the first place. Ask diligently for God to reveal himself, to show himself in your own life and you will find that your faith increases.

St. Thomas' Annual Meeting

Help will be needed to set up and clean up before and after the meeting. Please speak with kitchen




